# **Brief History of Governors Island**



#### **Brief Timeline of Governors Island**

The island was originally used as a fishing camp. Soon, the British took over, but later withdrew after the American Revolution

Military ground during the World War II

Open to Public for the first time in 2003; New parks and picnic areas

1524 -1812 1861 -1878 1912 -1993 1995 -2003 2003 -Present

During this time, the island served as a military function during the American Civil War - where it held prisoners of war, and served as an army headquarters

End of the island's military role and officially became a New York Historic District

#### **Description of Governors Island**

- 172 acre island located in NY Harbor
- Island accessed by ferries from Brooklyn and Manhattan
- Popular seasonal destination open to the public
- Includes free arts and cultural events, and recreational activities
- Many development zones available
- The Trust of Governors Island has invested \$300 million in infrastructure




# The Problem: Homelessness in NYC

## DeBlasio's Turning The Tide on Homelessness Initiative

- Proposes to build 90 new shelters in all five boroughs in every type of neighborhood.
- The only problem, community resistance to placing a shelter in your neighborhood.

### The Fix: Our Proposal

Repurpose program and the transformation of the Governors Island to provide shelter for the homeless in NY as well as introducing green technology to boost both the economy and the environment



#### General Proposal Plan




- To assist the state of New York in solving the homelessness issue and ensuring the emergence of New York as a strong community in support of a safe and healthy environment. The main efforts will be the creation of dormitories, training programs and jobs for the currently homeless.
- Project Timeline: Completion by December 31, 2021
- Budget: \$50 \$70 million
- Resources:
  - Resources/labor needed to house thousands of homeless people
  - Resources/labor to build factories and company headquarters
  - Resources/labor for installing and manufacturing green technology such as training programs
  - Resources/labor to build transportation services

#### **Deliverables**



- A 6-story men's dormitory to house 1,000 males.
- A 6-story men's dormitory to house 1,000 women.
- Construction of two, 500-occupancy, co-educational family units.
- A large state-of-the-art manufacturing and training facility to be occupied by several green technology companies.



#### **The Construction Process**



Signing of letters of intent with a minimum of 3 major green tech manufacturers; Site analysis & Site planning

Planning of landscape,and architectural details are proposed followed by the approval by the State on the building & repurpose program Commencement of construction on 6-story dormitories of both men and women

Commencement of construction on the two 500-occupancy, co-education/family housing units and the manufacturing and training facilities
